#### **FY2025 Budget and Budget Schedule**

The Board of Commissioners and Department of Management and Budget began the FY25 Budget process on March 5th with the Budget Overview and began discussions after the March 19th release of the Recommended Budget. The budget process documents can be viewed on the <u>county website</u>.

There are many budget-related meetings scheduled between now until the proposed budget adoption date of May 21st, including a Public Hearing on May 6th. You can find the <u>budget schedule here</u>. Follow along with the budget process by watching meetings on the <u>county meeting portal</u> and the <u>county YouTube channel</u>. In addition, all meetings will be replayed on Comcast Channel 24.

# NEW CAREER CENTER

Carroll County Government is excited to introduce a new on-line Career Center website, offering a modern and streamlined application process for job candidates.

The new Career Center contains postings for positions under the Board of County Commissioners authority. Interested applicants will view employment opportunities and access the new application portal through the Carroll County Government website. The home page of the government site has a "Career Opportunities" navigation button which links directly to the enhanced Career Center. The Career Center includes job openings, descriptions and closing dates, as well as the opportunity to enter a personal profile and apply for jobs.

# COUNTY TO CONDUCT HOUSING STUDY

Carroll County will be developing a new County Master Plan that will set the framework for the future land use decisions of the county. A Housing Study process will begin soon to provide information and recommendations for land use decision making, analyze zoning and regulatory environment, provide information on trends of all types of housing, and obtain necessary housing information on access to and barriers related to obtaining and maintaining a safe living environment for adults, families, parents/caregivers, children, and youth populations of Carroll County.







The study will consider existing conditions including current county and municipal zoning, infrastructure, development policies and regulations as well as identifying areas for housing. This study will analyze the county's needs to meet the Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing law's criteria and support long-term county housing needs and economic development opportunities.

# TEXT T0 911

Did you know that 911 call centers across Maryland accept text messages via text-to-911 service?

Customers of AT&T, Sprint, T-Mobile, and Verizon who are enrolled in their carriers' text messaging and/or data plan can send text messages to 911 in an emergency when they are unable to place a phone call. This includes those who are deaf, hard-of-hearing, or speech impaired, those who may find themselves in a situation where placing a voice call could put them in danger, or those who are experiencing a medical emergency and are unable to speak.

If you need emergency services and are unable to place a phone call, you can enter 911 in the "To" line of a new text message and begin your message with the location of the emergency and the type of help needed—police, fire, or emergency medical services. Once the message has been received at the 911 call center, a 911 specialist will respond. Be prepared to answer questions and follow instructions.



### ADDITIONAL TIPS FOR USING TEXT-TO-911

- As with all text messages, messages to 911 may take longer to receive, may be received out of order, and/or may not be received at all
- If text-to-911 service is not available, you will receive a bounce back message from your carrier telling you to place a phone or relay call instead
- Photos and videos cannot be received by 911 call centers via text message
- English is the preferred language for text messaging, though some limited translation services may be available in your area
- Keep text messages short and simple, and avoid using slang or abbreviations
- Including an additional contact on your text message may prevent it from being received by 911
- Call if you can, text if you can't

### Department of Fire and Emergency Medical Services Important Dates





Eligible county residents can receive a computer at a distribution event or through a distribution partner organization. 

# SPOTLIGHT WHO'S AT THE OTHER END OF A 911 CALL IN CARROLL COUNTY— READ ABOUT A DAY IN THE LIFE OF AN EMERGENCY COMMUNICATOR

Every year during the second week of April, telecommunications personnel in the public safety community are honored during National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week.

The Carroll County Emergency Communications Center provides 24-hour emergency 911 services to citizens, visitors, and businesses in Carroll County. Carl Luksic and Bridget Weishaar are two of the voices you may hear when calling 911. Both 911 operators took the time to answer a few questions about their career in emergency communications.

### What is the best part of being a 9-1-1 dispatcher?

Bridget: The best part of being a 911 dispatcher is knowing that you've helped somebody on their worst day. Even if we don't think it's their worst day anybody calling in thinks it is their worst day. Helping them through whatever emergency they have is very rewarding

### How many years of experience do you have in your field?

Carl: 31 years. I was a volunteer for 10 years in Baltimore County where I live. Then I worked at the Westminster Fire Department for 5 years. Then came here in 1993.

Bridget: I have been with the Emergency Operations Center for 24 years but this year will be my 30th year of experienceence in this field. I started out at age 16 as a firefighter EMT with the Gamber Volunteer Fire Company. Now my main focus is training the new employees coming in.

### What makes this job important?

Carl: I've been here for somebody that needs help on the other end. You know we're like the voice in the dark if you want to call it that. They don't see us but we're here for them as they call in and need us for help.

Bridget: I believe this job is important because you have a multitude of emergencies that could come in. You have to be able to make sure that you're prepared for whatever may come. You have to be sure that you're able to remain calm and listen to what the caller says. Knowing that you are helping somebody makes this job a very rewarding and enjoyable job.

### If there is one thing you could tell the community about 9-1-1, what would that be?

Bridget: We know it's an emergency but unfortunately we have to ask all of the questions that we ask. We're not delaying help but those questions help us get the appropriate help to the appropriate call. Sometimes there may be two calls in the same area so we need to ask those questions to see what call needs to be handled first and then send another unit to the second one. So as much as we know it frustrates people we really need them to answer the question so that we can help them in the best way possible.

### What is a memorable story from your career?

Carl: It's been long time ago. I had a call for a three-year-old. Mom and dad were putting in a small fishing pond in the backyard. The three-year-old they weren't watching got into the pond and basically drowned. I had to talk to the dad on the phone to relay the CPR instructions to mom over by the pond. Today as far as I know that little child's living so that was very satisfying to me.

Carroll County Farm Museum carrollcountyfarmmuseum.org 500 S. Center Street, Westminster, Maryland



Take a stroll back over a hundred years to the Carroll County Farm Museum, which is open to the public year-round. The Carroll County Farm Museum, located in Westminster, Maryland, provides the public with the opportunity to experience mid-nineteenth century rural life. The Farm Museum, the first of its kind in the State of Maryland, opened its doors to the public for the first time in 1966.

The museum grounds include original farm structures, such as the farmhouse and a bank barn, built in 1852-53. Other buildings include a 1700s log barn, smokehouse, springhouse, Living History Center, wagon shed, general store exhibit, firehouse, Blacksmith Shop, Tin Smith Shop, and a one-room schoolhouse. Farmyard Friends are available to visit spring through fall with a pair of Red Devon Oxen, heritage breed chickens, sheep, and goats. Period artifacts and antiques complete the rural experience for visitors.

Enjoy guided/self-guided tours, bring a picnic, play on the fun farm-themed playground, or come and enjoy one of the festivals held at the Farm Museum. For more information and updates, visit their <u>website</u> or <u>social media</u>.


### Piney Run Park & Nature Center 30 Martz Road, Sykesville, MD 21784

Piney Run Park and Nature Center, located near Sykesville, are operated by the Carroll County Department of Parks and Recreation. Natural, educational, and recreational opportunities abound as the park has 550 acres of fields, forest, and open space, over five miles of hiking trails, a lake, and recreational facilities.

The park was opened in 1974, featuring a 300-acre lake as its centerpiece, and provides multiple recreational activities such as fishing, boating and boat rentals, and park-sponsored fishing tournaments. Amenities also include tennis courts, playgrounds, climbing rock, picnic tables, and comfort stations.

The Piney Run Nature Center, Park Office, and six pavilions, which are available to rent during our open season, are all located near the main entrance which is accessed off White Rock Road.
