

	4. Update on Veteran Direct Home and Community Based Services Program Grant (Francine) – Three clients are
	being served. There is a new VA Fiscal Agency that Rick and Francine are working on getting our Veterans
	switched over to. Training is being held on October 5 <sup>th</sup> .
	5. <u>Update on Veteran Services Program Grant</u> (Bobbie Lawrence & Gina) –
	i. Kahlert Foundation Funding request was submitted 9-1-2022 and if awarded for the new grant it will be
	awarded 10-1-2022.
	ii. 2 Veterans are currently receiving emergency housing services, one of whom has obtained a new job and
	has found a unit and will move 10-1-2022
	iii. 15 food and gas Cards were given out in August.
	iv. The grant was able to help 3 Veterans with back rent.
	v. A selection has been made for the VSO position.
New Business	1. <u>PACT ACT-</u> Rick discussed some of the new presumptive conditions under the PACT ACT and will share the flyer
New Dusiness	with everyone. The PACT Act expands and extends eligibility for Veterans with toxic exposures of the Vietnam,
	Gulf War, and post-9/11 eras. It has added more than 20 new presumptive conditions for burn pits and other
	toxic exposures.
	2. <u>Agent Orange</u> – Rick & Francine discussed that the area of exposure has expanded for Vietnam Veterans exposed
	to Agent Orange. They are currently reaching out to former clients to notify them of the change. Compensation
	is done on a case-by-case basis.
	3. <u>Camp Lejeune Case – Clients cannot double dip on claims through a lawyer and through VA. VA compensation is</u>
	tax free. Court ordered payments are not tax exempt.
	4. North Carroll Pickle Ball- North Carroll Pickle Ball is set to start soon. They are in need of sponsors; signups are
	through Rec. & Park.
	5. <u>Grant Funding-</u> There are grant options for funding projects such as The American Legion or for shuttling
	veterans. Jessica Cook from Senator Cardin's office said that there are 2 routes to fund these projects and that
