What is the law and regulation?

- Defined in MD Environmental Article <u>9-1724.1</u> and COMAR <u>26.04.13</u>
- Persons must divert food residuals if they generate one ton or more a week if they are within 30 miles of an organics recycler*
- Report to political jurisdiction at end of year on totals recycled (including non-food residuals)



How do I know if I generate 1-ton or more food residuals?










Actual Weight Estimates

Bill Emerson Good Samaritan Food Donation Act

<u>Updated in 2022</u> - Donations of apparently fit grocery product or wholesome foods directly to those in need at zero cost by defined entities. Need has no definition

Food System Resiliency Council (FSRC)

Multiagency, collaborative initiative: engaging experts in food resilience across Maryland in better addressing food insecurity and food resilience across the state.

Reporting





- Only if you meet the mandate
- Calendar year totals
- To the <u>political jurisdiction</u> (23 counties + Baltimore City)
- By March 31
- ALL recycling food residuals, textiles, oils, paper, plastic, metals, mattresses, etc.



On-Farm Opportunities within Carroll County

- 30% of all farmland is equine use (~41,500 <u>acres</u>)

- Number of Dairy Cattle = 4,572






What We Do!



- Process 10,000-15,000 lbs of local produce during the summer in our vacant school kitchen (uglies & overages). Purchase local all year!
- Hire "lunch ladies" to make extra \$ during the summer
- Purchase local hydroponic lettuces
- Work with Ag class purchase pigs to serve pork during Farm to School week
- Purchase 30 bushels of apples a month from local orchard
- Serve local bakers muffins with local blueberries & apple cider doughnuts from local orchard




