Battery Recycling and Disposal Guide



When storing, transporting, or disposing batteries, please use caution to keep them from short-circuiting, overheating, or sparking. For lithium-ion batteries, place each individual battery in a separate plastic bag. For all other household batteries, use tape across the ends of to prevent battery ends from touching one another or striking against metal surfaces, then place in a plastic bag for disposal, or recycling. Damaged, Defective, and Recalled batteries require special handling and are not accepted in recycling programs and should never be put in the trash; contact the manufacturer directly. Many home improvement, office supply, and

Alkaline Non-rechargeable	AAA, AA, C, D, 6V, 9V	Various, everyday household items; clocks, toys, flashlights, remote controls, etc.	Should be recycled; drop-off at select retailers - call ahead to verify availability. Acceptable for disposal in trash.
Carbon Zinc (Heavy Duty) Non-rechargeable	AAA, AA, C, D, 6V, 9V	Various, everyday household items; clocks, toys, flashlights, remote controls, etc.	Should be recycled; drop-off at select retailers - call ahead to verify availability. Acceptable for disposal in trash.
Lithium/Lithium Ion (Li, Li-ion) (Button Cell, Coin) Non-rechargeable & Rechargeable	Sizes Vary	Cameras, calculators, computers, tablets, smart watches, electronics, etc.	DO NOT DISPOSE IN TRASH. Should be recycled; drop-off at select retailers - call ahead to verify availability. Accepted at Household Hazardous Waste Takeback.
Nickel-Cadmium (Ni-Cd) Rechargeable	AAA, AA, C, D, 6V, 9V	Cordless power tools, handheld vacuums, digital cameras, etc.	DO NOT DISPOSE IN TRASH. Should be recycled; drop-off at select retailers - call ahead to verify availability. Accepted at Household Hazardous Waste Takeback.
Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH or NiMH) Rechargeable	AAA, AA, C, D, 6V, 9V	Cordless power tools, handheld vacuums, digital cameras, two-way radios, etc.	DO NOT DISPOSE IN TRASH. Should be recycled; drop-off at select retailers - call ahead to verify availability. Accepted at Household Hazardous Waste Takeback.
Small Sealed Lead-Acid Rechargeable	2V, 6V, 12V	Mobility scooters, wheelchairs, ride-on toys, ATV's, lawn mowers, etc.	DO NOT DISPOSE IN TRASH. Accepted at the Recycling Center @ Northern Landfill. May be returnable to retailer.
Lead-Acid (AGM, SLA, Gel Cell) Rechargeable	6V, 12V	Cars, trucks, motorcycles, boats, etc.	DO NOT DISPOSE IN TRASH. Accepted at the Recycling Center @ Northern Landfill. May be returnable to retailer.
