Did you know that household garbage generated between Thanksgiving and New Year's Day, typically increases by as much as 25%? Here are some ideas for an Earthfriendly, low-waste holiday season!



- Make gifts! Get crafty and make some upcycled creations to give.
- Everyone appreciates a homemade sweet treat or a homecooked meal; package them in an attractive reusable container.
- Gift an experience like tickets to a show or a sporting event, a museum membership, or movie passes. Digital memberships for entertainment and wellness make a great gift too.
- Try buying secondhand at a thrift store or an antique shop.
- Winter blooming bulbs and plants will lift spirits and brighten up any room.
 - Consider the **durability** of a product before you buy it as a gift. Cheaper, less durable items often wear out quickly, creating waste and costing you money.
- Gift sustainably by giving items that can be reused or are multipurpose.
- Donate toys and other items that are in good condition.
- Choose items with minimal packaging and those made with recycled content.
- And remember to bring a reuseable shopping bag!

Holiday Meals & Entertaining

- Set the table with cloth napkins and reusable dishes, glasses, and silverware. Consider renting more formal tableware that you might not use very often.
- Try not to over-buy food for holiday meals and store leftovers in reusable containers.
- · Compost acceptable food scraps.

Holiday Decorating

DON'T LET THE HOLIDAYS GO TO WASTE!

- Garlands made from strung popcorn, cranberries, and dried oranges are unique and low waste.
- Invite family and friends to create holiday decorations such as ornaments made from old greeting cards or salt dough.
- Potpourri made from kitchen spices such as cinnamon and cloves creates an inviting, cozy atmosphere.
- Treecycle your holiday tree, free of charge, at the Northern Landfill located at 1400 Baltimore Blvd., Westminster.

Holiday Greetings, Gift Wrapping, & Packaging

- Substitute store bought wrapping paper with paper shopping bags and customize with paints, markers, and stamps. Newsprint, butcher's paper, and old newspapers work too.
- When choosing wrapping paper and greeting cards at the store, opt for non-metallic and glitter free as these are recyclable. Look for recycled items.
- Make gift tags from last year's holiday cards.
- Use **colored twine** in place of ribbon. **Reuse** bows, gifts bags, and tissue paper.
- Package gifts in a reuseable bag, an attractive piece of fabric, a decorative dish towel, etc. – the wrapping can be part of the gift!
- When packing gifts reuse gift boxes and cardboard boxes.
 Save air pillows, packing peanuts, or other packaging materials and reuse. Leftover tissue paper, old paper shopping bags, and shredded paper are also great reuse packing materials.
